- Learn how to conduct research such as public polling, stakeholder interviews, and data analysis.
- Meet with government officials to discuss their ideas for improving New York City.
- Become better leaders through problem solving and critical thinking.
- Strengthen their communication and public speaking skills.
- Make lifelong friends with the diverse group of peers in the program!

Sisters in Strength & Young Women's Advisory Council

Applications for GGE's Young Women's Advisory Council (YWAC) and Sisters in Strength (SIS) 2021-2022 cohort are live! YWAC and SIS is a wonderful opportunity for young folk to develop expertise in organizing around ending sexual and gender-based violence while uplifting healing, racial, and restorative justice through a Black queer feminist lens. Pioneered by GGE in 2004, **Sisters in Strength** (SIS) engages young people who are survivors of child sexual abuse and allies to survivors, providing space for survivor-centered, healing

justice approaches in the movement to end gender-based violence, sexual violence, and child sexual abuse.

Born out of the New York City Young Women's Initiative, housed at GGE, the **Young Women's Advisory Council** (YWAC) is a national program in which young cis and trans girls and GNC/NB youth of color engage in organizing and civic engagement strategies to push for transformative change through government and policy. In addition to our program in New York City, there are now seven local YWAC chapters across the country, run by local partners.

Both SIS and YWAC are stipended opportunities.

A Liberation Legacy (ALL) is a two-year project of GGE's Sisters in Strength Survivorship Program (SIS) and the New York City Young Women's Advisory Council (NYCYWAC) to highlight the current realities of young people living in New York City during a pandemic, mass uprisings, and major political transitions. ALL will share a vision for ending sexual and gender-based violence through community organizing and civic engagement while lifting up healing, racial and restorative justice through a Black queer feminist lens.

JustUS!

As you know, Black and brown youth are often both targeted by oppressive systems and also silenced in their experiences. To resist these harmful cycles, <u>Girls for Gender Equity (GGE)</u> and <u>Rising Ground's STEPS to End Family Violence</u> are collaborating to revise and redefine justice with JustUs: a gender-responsive diversion program for cis and trans girls and LGB/GNC young people between the ages of 15-20 that have ties to Brooklyn who are either involved, or at high risk of involvement, in the juvenile legal system. In JustUs, young people will come together to support, empower, teach, and learn from one another's experiences and learn to advocate for change.

JustUs currently offers a wide range of programs and services:

What's Your Story?:

a 3-month group on Tuesdays from 4-6pm, where young people can learn about themselves, their peers, their communities, and systems.

Advocacy for a New Narrative:

after participating in What's Your Story?,

young people will dive into creative ways to advocate for communities and against oppressive systems.

Let's talk about it!:

a drop-in group on Thursdays from 4-6pm, where participants decide what activities to do and what topics to talk about, based on monthly themes like self-care and liberated relationships.

Economic Empowerment:

a group that meets Tuesdays 6-7:30pm to explore one's relationship with money and career

interests, in addition to individual services.

One-on-one counseling:

virtual or in-person space for individuals to express themselves and be heard

Life coaching:

individual meetings to set SMART goals and build skills!

New York Civil Liberties Union

The Teen Activist Project (TAP) is the NYCLU's youth organizing program for New York City high school students, reaching nearly 200 young people in NYC. TAP members learn about civil liberties and legal issues, reproductive justice, community organizing and activism. Students work together as peer educators to make sure the youth of New York know their rights, create campaigns on issues the NYCLU is working on, and organize protests, rallies and marches across the city. TAP is a great opportunity for young people interested in law, health care, social justice and community organizing.

JAIA YOUth

JAIA YOUth is taking a few more applications for our Mindful Leaders Institute - MLI is year one (1) of a 3-year fellowship program. Black, Latinx & youth of color, Immigrant & LGBTQ youth are encouraged to apply. Also, youth who are interested in pursuing study or a career in mental health, public health, the Arts, or any service profession are encouraged to apply. Ages 16-2.

The Mindful Leaders Institute (MLI)— Is an evidence-informed, holistic personal development and service leadership development program that gives youth the mindset, discipline, and skills to lead meaningful lives of leadership and service. This full-year program provides youth with social-emotional learning (SEL), mindfulness/self-awareness training, mental health literacy (MLI), and ethical decision-making experiential learning and service opportunities. YOUth leave

with increased self-awareness, confidence, clear self-directed personal and career goals, as well as, tools and techniques for effective communication and healthier relationships. Each participant envisions, prepares, and executes a role in a community service project of their choice.

This program, starting late September- June will be a hybrid program (pending COVID 19 rates/CDC recommendations) or solely virtual. It will meet weekly on Tuesdays on Zoom and, Saturday (twice monthly) in person if possible, this is still to be determined (TBD). Youth will receive stipends quarterly. Upon successful completion individuals have an opportunity, take a **2-year leadership position on our JAIA YOUth Leadership Council** to receive advanced leadership, mentorship, and life coaching through high school and college.

Youth will be interviewed by recommendation only.

Please have youth fill out our application where they will have to add the contact info for a reference (parent, school personnel, adult over 25) and we will contact the adult.
