# The College Corner

**Ninth Grade:** We are almost at the end of the first semester of your student's 9<sup>th</sup> grade year! With this being said, it is important to remind your children to remain in contact with teachers to ensure their highest level of achievement for the entire school year. If your child has fallen behind with work or is finding the adjustment to high school to be overwhelming, the good news is, we have more than half an academic year to help them turn it around!

**Tenth Grade:** Encourage your child's highest performance in their classes and be mindful that both attendance and class averages are considered not only when applying, but when requesting letters of recommendation from staff members. It is never too early to be aware of college fairs and the possibilities of touring different campuses! Be sure to register for a PSAT exam before the end of the academic year if you have not already done so!

**Eleventh Grade:** Make sure that if your child has not yet done so, they take every step necessary towards taking the SAT test, which many universities consider during their admissions process. Encourage your student to study and attend any SAT preparatory classes being offered in your area. Be sure that your child is on track with completion of Regents exams in order to graduate. Lastly, we encourage you to visit colleges and universities as you see possible. If the trip isn't feasible, make sure to attend fairs!

**Twelfth Grade:** Make sure to fill out your FASFA, which can be done at <https://fasfa.ed.gov/>. Keep photocopies as you finish, and send your applications and essay. Have us send a transcript. Give the correct form to your counselor if the college wants to see second-semester grades.
